

This is the complete vocabulary for level 6 of Hebrew TODAY! To help your child learn Hebrew, you can quiz them on these words—or even learn with them.


Each box here presents a separate word, as explained below. If you use the words in full sentences as implied by the translations, you will be speaking correctly in Hebrew, or at least comprehensibly.

The **glyph** is a picture of the meaning expressed by the word. Use it to ensure that you are *thinking in Hebrew*, rather than *translating* from English.

The picture is explained.
The Hebrew spelling is given. (It usually resembles the glyph.)

The **association** is a silly sentence that links the word's pronunciation (**bold underlined**) with its meaning (in capitals).

The **pronunciation** is given in phonetic symbols:
